RE: Open Access Policy

Researchers funded by one of the Tri-Agencies (Canadian Institutes of Health Research, Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council, and Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council) must comply with the Tri-Agency Open Access policy, which states that within 12 months of publication, any peer-reviewed journal articles based on that Agency-supported research must be made freely available. The policy does not apply to book chapters, editorials, reviews, or conference proceedings. **The policy is in effect for grants awarded by CIHR on or after January 1, 2008 and for grants awarded by NSERC and SSHRC on or after May 1, 2015.**

There are 3 different ways to comply with the open access policy:

1. Publish in an open access journal; this may mean that the author will need to pay article processing fees to the journal. See "Paying OA Fees" on <http://libguides.usask.ca/c.php?g=16375&p=90315> for information on institutional assistance to authors paying these fees.
2. Publish in a traditional journal that allows authors to choose to make their article open access; the authors will need to pay an article processing fee.
3. Post the article in an institutional or subject repository.

Not all journals will permit authors to post their post-peer-reviewed article in an institutional or subject repository within the 12-month period. SHERPA Romeo <http://www.sherpa.ac.uk/romeo/index.php> provides information on what is allowed, and within what time period.

The U of S does not have an institutional repository, but the University of Calgary, University of Alberta, and University of Toronto repositories will all accept articles from researchers working elsewhere in Canada: <http://www.carl-abrc.ca/en/scholarly-communications/canadian-ir-repositories/adoptive-repositories.html>

Researchers may also deposit their articles in PubMed Central Canada, and in fact, CIHR encourages this: <http://www.science.gc.ca/default.asp?lang=En&n=A30EBB24-1#wsDF2EE930>
