RE: Why Articles Get Rejected

Have you ever submitted a paper to a journal and wondered why it was rejected?

Here are some top reasons that papers are rejected by journal editors by Dr. Peter Thrower:

- +the manuscript is incomplete
- +the English is not sufficient for the peer review process
- +the article contains elements that are suspected to be plagiarized
- +the article does not fit with the Aims and Scope of the journal
- +the procedure or analysis of the data is of poor quality
- +the data does not support the conclusions
- +the paper is simply an extension of a different paper
- +the findings are incremental and do not advance the field
- +the question behind the work is not of interest to the field
