

DSAAP FINANCIAL BREAKDOWN

Applicants answering 'YES' to the question:

Was your average annual family income over the last three years (January 1, 2022 to December 31, 2024) less than the amount indicated below, based on your family size?

Applicants must define all of the members comprising their family for each of the 3 years used to compute the average annual gross family income. Note that the applicant must include themselves when defining the members of their family; therefore, the applicant's employment income, as well as any student loans, and scholarship or bursary support received, must be provided for each of the 3 years in question. Child support and/or alimony payments are to be included in the total family income calculation. If a person in your family has had more than one source of income please add each separate income together and put the total of both (or more) incomes in the box for that person for that year.

- **1 Family Member: \$32,000**
- **2 Family Members: \$45,000**
- **3 Family Members: \$56,000**
- **4 Family Members: \$64,000**
- **5 Family Members: \$72,000**
- **6 Family Members: \$78,000**
- **7+ Family Members: \$85,000**

For the purpose of this application, the definition of 'family' will include those that occupy the same dwelling and do not have a usual place of residence elsewhere and are related to the individual (parent, grandparent, children, siblings, spouse, partner).

Note: Canada Revenue Agency Notice of Assessment must be provided for each family member (including the applicant) for each year in question. Be sure to redact any sensitive information such as the social insurance number prior to submitting the supporting documentation.

Add all 3 years together and divide by 3 to get 3-year average annual gross family income.
