## Indigenous Admissions Pathway

Through the College of Medicine Indigenous Admissions Program, Métis, Inuit and First Nations people can apply for admission to the Medical Doctor (MD) program of study. Up to twenty seats from each admissions cycle are allocated specifically for Indigenous applicants. The program offers supports, workshops, and individual meetings for Indigenous individuals interested in becoming medical doctors in Saskatchewan.
