Message from the Graduate Chair

Hello everyone. I can hardly believe it is now over a year since I was appointed as the Graduate Chair for the Health Sciences Graduate and Assistant Program Dean Graduate Studies for the CoM. It has been a real learning experience for me and I very much appreciate your support and patience. I recognize that it has been a year of many changes at both the college and programmatic level. It is my sincere hope that these and future changes will serve to improve the graduate student better experience and support supervisors and committees in their efforts. In the coming year we will continue to hone and improve the Health Sciences Graduate Program drawing upon recommendations from the review conducted in the Spring by CGPS as well as from feedback from students and faculty.

A key change that will be introduced pertains to the H.Sc. 990 Seminar requirement. Based

upon the program review and discussions at the annual meeting in (May 28th) we will shift away from regular bi-weekly seminars in favor of bi-annual research days. This change

is intended to provide a critical venue for students to present their research which is more compatible with busy schedules (for students and

supervisors). These research days will be supplemented by additional college-level seminars - likely one per term this coming year. A downside of this change will be the loss of the regular face-to-face communication seminars create. The introduction of a regular newsletter and revamped website are intended to help, in part, address this communication gap. That said, there is no substitute to actually gathering together. As such, we are planning on continuing with activities such welcome/orientation night (September and January), the annual meeting in the Spring as well as other sessions that will be developed in concert with the College of Medicine Graduate Student Society (CMGSS).

I hope all of you are enjoying the summer months, taking time to recharge your batteries (and vitamin D). I look forward to see you at the welcome night in September!
