HEALTH SCIENCES GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIP

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Health Sciences Graduate Scholarships (HSGS) Special Case Funding supports research within the Health Science Graduate Program in the College of Medicine (CoM) through awards to students who have demonstrated research and academic excellence.

The priority of this funding is to provide later-year support to as many worthy students as possible who are no longer eligible for the major University, CoM or Tri-Agency awards, and who have had program delays due to unforeseen circumstances. Specifically, this includes Master's students entering their third year and doctoral students entering years four and five.

The HSGS award program is administered by the Health Sciences Program and will only be available when surplus funding allows.

Award Amounts & Terms

• Master's students: \$6,333 (4 months)

PhD students: \$8,000 (4 months)

The HSGS is a cost-shared award, and Supervisors are required to contribute \$2,666 for Master's or \$3,332 for PhD which constitutes approximately 40% of the 4-month award amount. These are 4-month awards and while students are eligible in multiple years they must apply for each individually.

Special Case HSGS funding begins January 1st, 2024 and extends until April 30th, 2024 (4 months).

ELIGIBILITY

To hold a HSGS, you must be a fully-qualified, full-time Graduate Student in good standing for the duration of the award. In order to apply for and to hold a HSGS award a student must have and maintain a GPA greater than or equal to 80%.

MSc students are eligible to apply for Special Case Funding within the first 5 years of their program and MSc-PhD transfer students/PhD students are eligible to apply for Special Case Funding within the first 7 years of their program.

Alternative Funding

Students are encouraged to apply for alternative sources of funding for which they are eligible.

Students who win **external** competitive scholarships whose total value equals or exceeds the total value of a HSGS +\$6000 are not eligible to receive an award under this program for the period of the academic year covered by the external scholarship.

Students who win compatible external competitive scholarships of total value below the total value of the HSGS + \$6,000 may apply for funding under this program. The combined value of all awards may not exceed the total value of the HSGS + \$6,000, with the supervisor portion and then the HSGS portion reduced by any surplus. Students must provide documentation regarding the conditions of the external awards and a copy of their award letters when applying for a HSGS.

HSGS awardees will be paid as per University policy. If the terms of compatible external awards do not coincide with the HSGS period of support (January to April), then the above policies will apply to the overlapping payment periods and the value caps will be calculated on a pro-rated basis

Additional funding includes all awards, stipends, bursaries, scholarships, and any other alternative award funding source. This does not include any wages earned by the student in the up to 20 hours/week of work permitted. Those wages are not considered to be a part of alternative funding, nor part of the matching funds required from the supervisor.

If you are awarded any alternative funding you are required to inform ovdr.grad@usask.ca

Award Termination

If a student graduates, discontinues their program of study, or no longer meets the eligibility requirements then support from this fund shall cease. The student is responsible for notifying ovdr.grad@usask.ca to cease funding, and any funds held while ineligible must be returned.

ASSESSMENT

Applications will be assessed by the Health Science Graduate Programs Committee.

Assessment Criteria

The following criteria will be considered:

- 1. Research achievements, including; publications, presentations, and awards
- 2. Leadership and community engagement
- 3. Academic average (GPA)

Cumulative average of courses taken in the current graduate program. Program coursework must be completed in order to be eligible to apply.

- 4. Letters of Support indicating recommendation for funding
 - a. One letter of recommendation and commitment of funding from the supervisor
 - b. One letter of recommendation from a non-supervisor referee

APPLICATION DOCUMENTATION

New Applications

- 1. Applicants must fill out a copy of the HSGS application form
- 2. Applicants must obtain a Canadian Common CV which should include a summary of research achievements including publications, presentations and awards.
- 3. Applicants must submit a maximum 1 page document outlining the rationale for applying for this award and the reasons for delays in research progress.
- 4. One supervisor letter of recommendation, in PDF format, must be sent directly to ovdr.grad@usask.ca from the supervisor.
- 5. One non-supervisor letter of recommendation, in PDF format, must be sent directly to ovdr.grad@usask.ca from the referee
- 6. All GPA calculations will be completed by the Health Sciences program administrator. *Transcripts are not required.*

Applicants are responsible for submitting items 1, 2, & 3 directly to ovdr.grad@usask.ca. Items 4, 5, & 6 should be submitted by the applicant's referees and graduate coordinator. Applicants are responsible for ensuring their referees submit their letters on time. Late submissions will not be accepted from those who did not follow up with the OVDR office prior to the deadline. The OVDR office will then review the application to make sure it has all the required documents.

Approval Process

By submitting this application through email, the student and supervisor acknowledge that all information in the application is true and correct.

Once the application has been submitted, our office will go through and ensure that all the required documents are attached and comply with the guidelines. If they do, we will approve the application to move forward to adjudication.

AWARD CONDITIONS

Notification of Success

Award decisions will be sent to successful applicants by 4 December 2023. Following this, the successful applicants will have 7 days to submit the signed acceptance letter to the Health Sciences Graduate Program Coordinator or notify the office of any delays in completing the paperwork.

Publication Acknowledgement

All publications resulting from the research funded by the grant must acknowledge the University of Saskatchewan, College of Medicine, HSGS funding.
