2019-20 Award for Excellence in the CanMEDS Collaborator Role

Purpose

To recognize medical residents who have excelled in the **CanMEDS Collaborator role** while at the College of Medicine, University of Saskatchewan.

The Award

- Two awards as determined by the Awards Committee are available on an annual basis.
- One award will be granted to a resident training in Family Medicine; the other award will be granted to a resident training in a Royal College specialty-training program.

Eligibility

Any resident currently enrolled in a College of Medicine (RCPSC or CFPC) postgraduate training program at the University of Saskatchewan.

Nomination Process

Each year the Postgraduate Medical Education Office issues a call for nominations. Undergraduate medical students, residents, faculty and staff of the College of Medicine are eligible to nominate a candidate. Self-nominations are ineligible.

Nominations are currently being accepted for the 2019-20 Award for Excellence in the CanMEDS Collaborator Role

Nominations must be submitted as a single PDF file with documents in the following order:

1. Nomination form
2. Letter from nominator
3. Two additional letters of support
4. Additional supporting evidence

NOTE: All supporting documents must address the criteria listed below. Incomplete/improperly formatted submissions will not be accepted.

Nominations must be submitted electronically as a single PDF file to Della Toews at della.toews@usask.ca.

The deadline for submitting nominations is Friday, July 17, 2020. Nominations received after the deadline will not be considered.

Criteria

1. Excellence in collaboration in different settings (e.g., clinical, teaching, continuing education, research, program administration, and social settings). Examples include, but are not limited to, intra-professional care, inter-professional teams, collaborative teaching sessions, collaborative research projects, and addressing resident issues in the program).
2. Demonstrated role model behaviors in improving workplace relationships and collaborative workplace culture.
3. Evidence of resident's collaboration skills and behaviors linked to satisfaction and positive impact on educational outcomes in the program or in a more generalized area.
4. Demonstrated commitment to improving collaboration skills.

Selection

Nominations are adjudicated by the CanMEDS Awards Committee, an ad hoc subcommittee of the Postgraduate Medical Education Committee. This committee includes the PGME Dean (or designate), a Department Head, one faculty member each from Academic Family Medicine (or designate) and a Royal College Specialty, an undergraduate student representative and a postgraduate resident representative. Other members may be added as designated by the Dean, College of Medicine.

- **Letter from nominator** (*must not exceed two pages*).
- **A minimum of two additional letters of support** from undergraduate medical students, residents, faculty or staff of the College of Medicine. Letters must specifically address how the nominee meets the selection criteria. *Each letter of support must not exceed one page.*
- **Additional supporting evidence** (such as letters from peers, patients etc.) should be attached. *Supporting documentation must not exceed two pages.*

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
