



2025-2026 Dr. Pat Brophy Memorial Scholarship

Purpose

To recognize a post-graduate resident in the PGME program, College of Medicine, who demonstrates passion in leadership towards enhancing the health of children, through research, community work, advocacy or clinical care.

The Award

- One award (across all programs) with a minimum value of \$2,000.00 is available on an annual basis.

Eligibility

Any resident currently enrolled in a College of Medicine (RCPSC or CFPC) postgraduate residency program at the University of Saskatchewan.

Selection Criteria

Selection is based upon the merits of the submissions, as determined by the Award Committee. Selection criteria will be based on the following:

- Demonstrates leadership in areas which are aimed to improve the health of children.
- Shows passion and commitment to child health through one or more of the following areas:
 - Research focused on pediatric health or child-centred outcomes.
 - Community engagement or service activities benefiting children or families.
 - Advocacy efforts aimed at improving pediatric health policies, services, or awareness.
 - Excellence in clinical care for children, including compassion, quality of care, and dedication to patient well-being.

Nomination Process

Each year the Postgraduate Medical Education Office issues a call for nominations. Candidates may apply or be nominated for this award.

Nominations are currently being accepted for the 2025-2026 Dr. Pat Brophy Memorial Scholarship. The deadline for nominations is May 29, 2026

Selection Process

Applications for this award are adjudicated by an ad-hoc sub-committee of the PGME, College of Medicine, University of Saskatchewan.

Supporting Documentation

- **Letter from nominator** (*must not exceed one page*) must be submitted outlining why the nominee would be considered for this award. The letter should directly address the selection criteria. If the resident is self-nominating, they are responsible for writing this letter.
- A **minimum of one additional letter of support**, which may be from supervisors, faculty members, community members or others who can speak to the individual’s contributions to enhancing the health of children.
- A **focused CV** (maximum 5 pages) of the resident being nominated. This CV should demonstrate evidence of research, community work, advocacy or clinical/public health service which contributes to enhancing the health of children.

Nominations must be submitted as a single PDF file with documents in the following order:

1. Nomination form
2. Letter from nominator
3. One or more additional letters of support
4. Resident CV

NOTE: All supporting documents must address the selection criteria. Incomplete/improperly formatted submissions will not be accepted.
