The QRCE curriculum was developed by the Saskatchewan Ministry of Health in collaboration with PGME to train residents on how to improve the written and verbal referral/consultation communication. The purpose of the interdisciplinary workshop is to consolidate what had been learned in the first two parts - the Boot Camp introductory session and the online modules. The workshop involves an appraisal of de-identified referral and consult letters using the Saskatchewan Referral/Consult checklist.

The University of Saskatchewan offered a record 130 training positions in the 2022 CaRMS R1 match. All positions matched successfully, and residents commenced training on July 1, 2022. To meet provincial needs, a new rural Family Medicine program was established. The South East Family Medicine Residency Training Program is the newest addition to the University of Saskatchewan's cadre of exemplary FM residency programs and is administratively based out of Moosomin. Humboldt, Weyburn, and Moosomin make up the three home base sites with two residents training full-time in Moosomin and one full-time resident in Humboldt and in Weyburn.

Canvas LMS for PGME Programs

Canvas by Instructure is the Learning Management System used at USASK, allowing for instructors and students to share content, engage in discussions, collaborate, and submit, mark, and provide feedback on assessments. Commonly used to deliver traditional term-based courses, Canvas can also be used to manage individual events, like the annual PGME Bootcamp, regularly recurring events, like academic half-days, or even continuous learning opportunities.

As Canvas arranges content into distinct modules, you can guide your learners through content in a predictable order, or allow them to consume content freely at their own rate. Publishing teaching materials and external links, managing assignments, quizzes, and other self-assessments, and facilitating online discussions, Canvas allows you to create a learning space unique to your needs and the needs of your learners. And with Canvas' reporting tools, you can track learner participation and use of the course.

Integrating directly with other collaboration and communication tools, like Zoom for web conferencing and Panopto for video management, Canvas can act as a central space for all your digital communication within a course or group.
