




PGME ACCREDITATION

ADMISSIONS

The 2024 CaRMS R-1 match opened to applicants on September 20, 2023. The University of Saskatchewan is pleased to report that both a new site, Anesthesia, and a new program, Dermatology, will launch in Regina on July 1, 2024. In past matches, the USask partnered with other universities to offer networked and sponsored training in Dermatology and other disciplines not offered at the USask. Applicants matched to the networked/sponsored position had a return of service commitment to return to Saskatchewan and practice upon completion of training in another province. Typically there is strong interest from USask medical students for Dermatology and we anticipate the new program will result in retention of dermatologists in the province. Regina currently offers full time training in Family Medicine, Internal Medicine, O&G, Pediatrics, PM&R and Psychiatry. The addition of this new program and training site will allow Regina to provide additional training opportunities for CaRMS applicants.

EVALUATION



2023 PGME Work and Learning Environment Survey

Thank you to everyone who participated in the 2023 PGME Work and Learning Environment Survey! Between June and August 2023, a total of 249 people completed the survey, including 145 residents, 65 faculty, 23 program directors, and 16 program administrators. Feedback provided will help us better understand and work to improve the work and learning environment within postgraduate medical education. A summary of results will be shared widely within the coming months.

RESEARCH

The recruitment and retainment of health care providers in rural or remote communities in Saskatchewan has been a long-term challenge. While some evidence suggests that extensive placement, coupled with positive experiences, of medical students or post-graduate trainees in rural clinical rotations bolsters rural practice, Saskatchewan has relied heavily on internationally trained medical graduates (IMGs) to help fill positions in these communities.

Various supports exist in Saskatchewan to assist IMGs in obtaining required licensures to practice (e.g., Saskatchewan international Physician Practice Assessment (SIPPA) and the College of Medicine's IMG support program) or into

postgraduate residency training (one-on-one CaRMS prep support for the application process). These programs place heavy emphasis on rural or remote practice, however provincial statistics show low IMG retention rates in rural Saskatchewan communities overall.

With funding awarded to Dr. Saxena from the Saskatchewan Ministry of Immigration and Career training, PGME has completed a research program to help address these gaps, with the intention to find better ways to support IMGs in Saskatchewan so that they remain in the province, ideally supporting rural and remote health initiatives. This research initiative resulted in various outputs, including:

- Realist Review: The purpose was to explore the key contextual factors and underpinning mechanisms which influence the success or failure of support programs for immigrant international medical graduates in a foreign healthcare setting.
- 2. Environmental Scan: Was guided by the following objectives: (a) To examine current practices in Canada (and other countries) for getting IMGs into practice either via residency or alternate routes. (b) To explore the literature (peer reviewed publications, grey literature, and institutional websites) pertaining to barriers and success factors for IMG routes to unsupervised clinical practice in Saskatchewan.
- 3. Research Report. The overall purpose was to explore ways to improve IMG physician retention in Saskatchewan, with a focus on rural/remote practice locations. The specific aims of this research report were to:
 - Determine barriers and challenges faced by IMGs for entering unsupervised medical practice (including into residency and practice readiness assessment (PRA) programs).
 - 2. Identify success factors that lead to residency, PRA programs and successful outcomes.

 Determine factors linked to practice location choice and reasons for mobility.

Six organizational stakeholder groups and 56 IMG physicians participated in this study. Data was collected between May 2022 – April 2023 via interviews, focus groups, surveys, and document analysis.

The data collected in this study (Realist Review, Environmental Scan, and Research Report) was used to develop recommendations to improve options for IMGs in terms of educational programming, supports for transition to SIPPA and medical residency, and on-going practice in the province. All reports and recommendations have been shared with the Saskatchewan Ministry of Immigration and Career Training.

Teaching Improvement Project Systems (TIPS)

The Teaching Improvement Project Systems (TIPS) for Residents course wrapped up its learning sessions for the 2023-24 academic year.

Congratulations to all of our first year residents who successfully completed this mandatory course, aimed to helping residents improve their teaching skills.

A huge thank you goes out to the project lead for the TIPS course, Sean Polreis, Teaching & Learning Specialist with Faculty Development, College of Medicine. Sean works closely with PGME admin and the number of facilitators who lead the 2 day learning sessions.

STAKEHOLDERS CORNER



New USask Indigenous health department first of its kind in Canada

The Department of Indigenous Health and Wellness received University Council approval in April 2023, and will serve as a welcoming space for Indigenous health researchers, learners, and faculty in the college. Indigenous health is a priority for the college and its new department will include collaborations across the university.

"We're creating the structure that will allow Indigenous voices to tell us where we need to go," said Dr. Janet Tootoosis (MD), interim vice-dean Indigenous health. "We're creating a community but we're also creating a physical space where people can connect and learn about what's happening in the College of Medicine."

The new department will be Indigenous-led and ensure research is informed by Indigenous community needs. It will also influence how medical education and scholarship incorporates Indigenous knowledge and systems.

"It's important that the College of Medicine has this department because Indigenous people are harmed in the health system," said Tootoosis.

The department goals are to meaningfully address Indigenous health inequities, knowledge translation, systemic racism, and the scarcity of strength-based Indigenous health research. It will also build capacity for the college to effectively respond to the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's (TRC) Calls to Action.

ACADEMIC CORNER

Knowledge Transfer in PGME Educational Administration, Operations and Leadership

PGME would like to highlight the article "Using Theory-Informed Group Processes to Make TIMELESS Promotion Decisions" by Kinnear et al. (2023). In this article the authors consider why clinical competency committees (CCCs) group decision-making processes should be supported by theory and describe how a competency-based time variable training pilot program integrated different theories to support the defensibility of CCC processes.

ABSTRACT: Competency-based medical education (CBME) depends on effective programs of assessment to achieve the desired outcomes and goals of training. Residency programs must be able to defend clinical competency committee (CCC) group decisions about learner readiness for practice, including decisions about time-variable resident promotion and graduation. In this article, the authors describe why CCC group decision-making processes should be supported by theory and review 3 theories they used in designing their group processes: social decision scheme theory, functional theory, and wisdom of crowds. They describe how these theories were applied in a competency-based, time-variable training pilot—
Transitioning in Internal Medicine Education Leveraging Entrustment Scores
Synthesis (TIMELESS) at the University of Cincinnati internal medicine residency program in 2020-2022—to increase the defensibility of their CCC group decision-making. This work serves as an example of how use of theory can bolster validity arguments supporting group decisions about resident readiness for practice.


Farewell
