## 23. Postgraduate Appeals Adjudication Committee (PAAC) Terms of Reference

The purpose of this committee is to establish Appeals Adjudication Boards (AAB) that will hear Postgraduate Medical Education program appeals.

## 23.1 PAAC Membership:

- Chair (non-voting): A University faculty member of the College will be appointed as Chair or designate, in case of conflict of interest or lack of availability
- Two (2) faculty members: including one of whom is a program director and one who is not
- one (1) resident
- 23.1.1 The PAAC will establish a pool and select the members of each individual AAB. Individual AAB membership will be approved by the Associate Dean, PGME.
- 23.1.2 A Pool from which the members of the AAB will be selected by the PAAC:
  - Chair: University faculty member of the College or designate in case of conflict of interest. 2-year term, renewable once for a second two-year term. All current departmental/divisional Program Directors
  - 5 Residents representing RDoS (Resident Doctors of Saskatchewan) from different programs will be selected by RDoS for a minimum one-year term and maximum of 3 years
  - 5 Faculty recommended by the Nominations Committee. Terms are three (3) years
  - A pool member may only serve on one adjudication board per year
  - Members chosen on AAB may not be based in the same residency training program as the appellant

## 23.2 <u>Terms of Reference:</u>

- 23.2.1 Upon receipt of the notice of appeal, the Postgraduate Medical Education Office will notify the Chair of the PAAC of the notice of appeal.
- 23.2.2 The PAAC shall independently constitute the AAB for each appeal to avoid conflict of interest.
- 23.2.3 Postgraduate appeals will be heard by the AAB.
- 23.2.4 Members of the PAAC and any AAB shall be guided by the PGME policy, 'Resident Appeals'.
