



SPEAKER BIOGRAPHIES



Dr. Marlon Danilewitz is an assistant professor at the University of Toronto and the associate medical director of general psychiatry at Ontario Shores Centre. He is the conference chair for the Canadian Psychiatric Association's annual meeting and co-chair of the CPA's sections on addiction psychiatry.



Dr. Robert Kleinman is a clinician-scientist and Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychiatry. He completed his medical degree at Queen's University, psychiatry residency at Stanford, and fellowship in addiction psychiatry at Mass General Brigham (Harvard). He provides treatment to patients experiencing substance use disorders, behavioural addictions, and concurrent disorders at the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health.



Dr. David Gratzler is a Toronto-based physician. He works at the Centre for Addiction and Mental Health, where he is an attending psychiatrist and co-chief of the General Adult Psychiatry and Health Systems Division, overseeing the clinical and academic work of 110+ psychiatrists. He is an associate professor at the University of Toronto. He reviews for several journals, and he is an associate editor of both *The Canadian Journal of Psychiatry* and *JMIR Mental Health*. He leads CIHR-funded research in e-therapies.



Dr. Paul Zarkowski is a Senior Psychiatric Supervisor at Sound Behavioural Health in Seattle and serves as Clinical Associate Professor in the Department of Psychiatry and Behavioural Sciences at the University of Washington. At the UW, Dr. Zarkowski sees patients in the Psychiatric Emergency Service at Harborview Medical Center and lectures on mood and anxiety disorders as well as the evaluation of geriatric patients. He has published journal articles and book chapters on improving suicide assessment, addressing the clinical needs of special populations, and using EEG in psychiatric applications. Ongoing research interests include strategies for improving psychiatric medication regimens for optimum outcomes



Dr. Jennifer Hensel is an Associate Professor in the Department of Psychiatry at the University of Manitoba. She completed her residency training at the University of Toronto and obtained a Master of Science in Health Services Research from the Institute for Health Policy, Management and Evaluation at the University of Toronto, followed by a Research Fellowship in the Department of Psychiatry. Prior to joining Manitoba's Department of Psychiatry in 2017, she worked as an adult psychiatrist at the Toronto-based Women's College Hospital and was the Inaugural Innovation Fellow and Mental Health lead for the Institute for Health Systems Solutions and Virtual Care.
