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Resources and Supports after the R-1 Match

The Office of Student Affairs (OSA) and the Office of Career Advising & Mentorship (OCA&M) wish you the best for your CaRMS Match Day. We are here to assist you through this important time in your medical school journey.

You can opt in to be alerted a day early (on March 3, 2025) if you have not matched. This information will be shared by CaRMS to the Associate Dean only. To do so, please log into your account on CaRMS' website (www.carms.ca) and opt-in to early notification to the program by Thursday February 20, 2025 at 15:00 ET, as well as filling in the one45 form opting in to early reach-out by the program by Tuesday February 25, 2025, at 23:59.

If you have not matched in the first iteration of the residency match, we encourage you to contact the OSA and OCA&M who will support you on your path forward.

Office of Career Advising & Mentorship

The OCA&M team is available to provide personalized assistance to students who have not matched. Students can meet with one of the Clinician Career Advisors or the Coordinator to discuss post-CaRMS reflections regarding application strategies for the second iteration of the residency match. Clinician Career Advisors can assist students in specialty selection, application decisions, preparation of new application documents (CV and personal letters), and mock interview practice.

Canadian Federation of Medical Students (CFMS)

At the CFMS, our priority as an organization is to advocate for the best possible medical school experience for all medical learners by addressing gaps in our current system, including the match process and availability of residency spots in Canada. It is many students' worst fear to find out that they are unmatched, and we know that it is incredibly difficult to predict who will receive this news. We want to emphasize two things as we get closer to Match Day:

1. If you go unmatched in the first iteration, please know that you are not alone. We encourage all students reading this who do match to help us change the culture around going unmatched by destigmatizing it.
2. We are here and we want to help you. In this post we want to let you know what support we are able to provide in advance. We will be sharing these resources again on our website and on social media on Pre-Match Day so that they are readily available for you to revisit if you find yourself in this position.

If you are not matched after the first iteration, please get in touch with us by emailing Astha Burande (Director of Education) at education@cfms.org and Emily Liang (Education Associate) at associateeducation@cfms.org who will be monitoring emails and connecting you with support. All information shared with us at either of these emails will remain strictly confidential between the two of us.

CFMS Unmatched Peer Support Network:

The CFMS's peer mentorship network takes two forms. First, you can reach out to the Director of Education or Education Associate at education@cfms.org or associateeducation@cfms.org to be paired with a buddy/mentor who has been unmatched in a previous year. We will do our best to pair students with mentors who have similar interests or schools. Once again, we will all maintain confidentiality and protect your personal information.

The network is also accessible through the peer support forum website. This forum is strictly moderated and can be accessed at peersupportnetwork.net. The page is restricted to CFMS moderators, uCMG mentors and current uCMG students to strictly maintain privacy and comfort. Please sign up at peersupportnetwork.net. This is a forum to ask any and all questions you may have, including about your options, resources and available support. Note: you can join anonymously or using your name, whichever you prefer.

- **Second Iteration Application Reimbursement:** The CFMS is excited to offer all unmatched members \$150 to support applying to the second iteration of the R-1 match. The reimbursement form is available here (<https://cfms.org/files/Reimbursement-Form-2nd-Round-Applications-2023.pdf>). The reimbursement form must be completed and submitted to administrative@cfms.org by May 31, 2024.
- **Wellness Supports:** We encourage all learners to be in close contact with their Student Affairs offices for comprehensive support during this process. The Canadian Medical Association provides a landing page (<https://www.cma.ca/supportline>) with links to National Help Lines, as well as Provincial and Territorial Physician Support Services that are freely available to medical students 24/7. - **SafeSpaces Peer Support Session for Unmatched Students (TBD):** In the past, we have partnered with the CMA to host a psychiatrist-moderated peer support session for our unmatched students to help with connecting students with this experience. This is open only to unmatched Canadian Medical Graduates from the 2024 match cycle, and can be participated in anonymously if that is preferred. The SafeSpaces team is in the process of working with the CMA to plan for this year's session, and we will let you know as soon as we know more.
- **CFMS Matchbook:** The 2023-2024 Matchbook is accessible to CFMS members via our website (using your CFMS login) and is accessible here (<https://www.cfms.org/what-we-do/education/cfms-matchbook>). The matchbook is accessible with your CFMS login - if you do not already have an account, this account can be created easily but does require the code which you can get by reaching out to the CFMS Rep at your school or by emailing our office (administrative@cfms.org).

Clerkship Extension course (Year 5)

If students have not matched after participating in the residency match, the Clerkship Extension course offers participation in an additional year of undergraduate training. You can find the year 5 syllabus here: <https://medicine.usask.ca/documents/ugme/syllabi/medc-505.pdf>.

Year 5 requirements include deferring graduation, paying an additional year of tuition, and typically participating in the 2nd iteration of CARMS.

The fifth year is composed of four modules: clinical electives, career advising and mentorship, research, and clinical experiences. Individualized learning plans will be developed with the student, UGME, OCA&M, and OSA to improve the chances of success in the future residency match.
