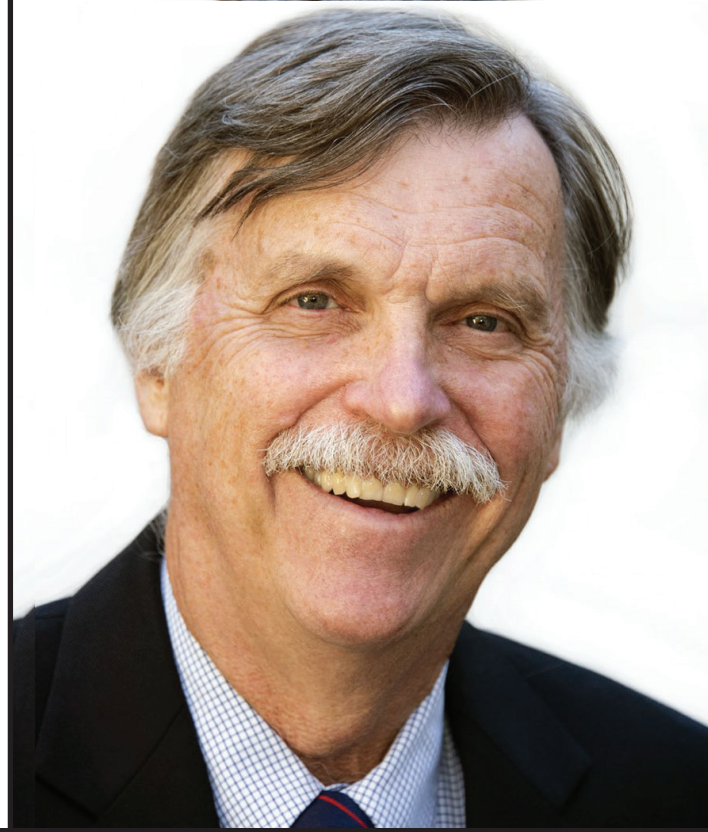

Lessons Learned from Global and Rural Surgery

Roy Kirkpatrick is a General Surgeon in practice in Huntsville, Ontario where he has been on staff for 38 years. After graduating from Queen's University he interned at the University of Manitoba and trained in General Surgery at the University of Ottawa. His practice has been eclectic and has included times as a ship's doctor in the North Atlantic, an Emergency Room Physician at the Ottawa General Hospital, rural locums in Northern Ontario and Nunavut, and global surgical experiences in rural India, Papua New Guinea, Haiti, and Pakistan. As his surgical practice has wound down he has been increasingly involved with administrative medicine with the Northern Ontario School of Medicine, the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, the College of Physicians and Surgeons of Ontario. He continues to provide telemedicine consultation services for Medecins Sans Frontiers.
