## Trauma Quality Improvement: What Gets Measured, Gets Better

Dr. Parry graduated from Medical School in 1996 from the University of Western Ontario in London, Ontario and completed his residency in general surgery there as well. He went on to complete a trauma and critical care fellowship at Grady Memorial Hospital, Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia under the tutelage of Drs. Rozycki and Feliciano.

Dr. Parry returned to Victoria Hospital, London Health Sciences Centre in 2003 and is now a Professor of Surgery and Critical Care Medicine at Western University. He served as Medical Director of Critical Care Trauma Centre and Critical Care Outreach Team, Victoria Hospital (2009-2012), Trauma Medical Director for London Health Sciences Centre (2011-2023) and Chief of Surgery at Victoria Hospital (2015-2023). He has held several leadership roles with the Canadian Association of General Surgeons as well as the Trauma Association of Canada.

Dr. Parry is active with the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and is the Chair for the General Surgery Examination Board. He has served on the Committee on Trauma for the American College of Surgeons as the Chair of the Surgical Skills Committee and member of the Education and ATLS Committees.

His main academic interests are in clinical outcomes in trauma, critical care, acute care surgery as well as complex abdominal wall reconstruction.
