### A Review of Best Practices for Management of Severe Burn Injuries and Regional Burn Triage

Dr. Josh Wong completed his medical school at the University of Alberta in 2009 and residency training in Plastic Reconstructive Surgery at the University of Alberta in 2016. He further specialized with burns and trauma surgical critical care fellowship training at Harborview Medical Center in Seattle Washington from 2016-2017. He is now an Associate Professor of Surgery with particular interest in burns, cold injury, trauma, complex wounds and skin malignancies. His research interests are burn clinical outcomes, quality improvement, and artificial intelligence. He also has particular interest in technologies to improve burn care, international surgery, global health, and burn prevention/education. He is the clinical competency chair for the residency program as well as the quality assurance officer of the Edmonton Firefighters' Burn Treatment center.
