

Indigenous Studies Prerequisite Requirement

Beginning in the **2024 application cycle** (for entry in 2025), applicants must have an Indigenous studies prerequisite completed at the time of application. For those currently enrolled in an undergraduate program, a 3-credit unit (1 term) university-level course with a focus on teaching the historical context and effects of colonialism on Indigenous peoples is required. For applicants that have completed their undergraduate degree as of Spring 2022 and are enrolled in a graduate program or not attending a post-secondary institution, a certificate of completion from the [Indigenous Canada](#) course offered by the University of Alberta **OR** [Building an Awareness of Cultural Humility](#) course offered by the University of Saskatchewan will meet the prerequisite requirement for the 2024 application cycle.

Below is a list of some of the **suggested** courses that meet the Indigenous studies requirement at Saskatchewan post-secondary institutions. We will continue to update this list as suitable courses are identified in and out of Saskatchewan. If you are interested in confirming the acceptability of course(s), please email med.admissions@usask.ca and provide the institution; course name and number, credit units, and an active link to the course syllabus or attach a PDF of the course syllabus to your email. The course should have a focus on Indigenous peoples in Canada and should include a critical perspective on settler colonialism and its effects on Indigenous peoples.
