Undergraduate Medical Education Awards

Drs. Shashi and Pravesh Suri Award

Dr. Shashi Suri, an anesthesiologist, and Dr. Pravesh Suri, a family physician, both practice in Regina for the Saskatchewan Health Authority. They have established this award to show their appreciation of the University of Saskatchewan medical school and promote academic excellence. There are two separate awards. One for first-year student and one for second-year student in the top 10% of their class.

Jon Lambi Memorial Scholarship

Jon N. Lambi was admitted to the College of Medicine in the fall of 1979 and passed away in a car accident on October 9, 1979. Jon was held in high esteem by all who knew him and in his memory a \$2000 scholarship was established. The recipient is chosen from students entering second year in the top 10% of their class who have demonstrated aptitude for the study of Medicine combined with a contribution to the undergraduate life of their classmates.

Weisdorff Bursary

Gifted to a resident of Saskatchewan or the Canadian Territories who has demonstrated strong academic performance.

Shirley Anne Bergman Award in Integrative Medicine

To honor their mother, and to support the advancement of integrative medicine, the children of Shirley Bergman created this award, to be presented annually to a third or fourth year medical student that has shown an interest in, or aptitude for, the area of integrative medicine.

Wardman Family Scholarship for Indigenous Students in Medicine

To recognize the academic achievement of an Indigenous student completing second year at the College of Medicine, University of Saskatchewan.

Dr. Jim and Felicity O'Carroll Award for Resiliency

This award recognizes the student who weathers the trials and tribulations of life while balancing the demands of medical school.

Undergraduate Medical Education Awards

The Medicine Chest Award in Indigenous Virtual Health

Awarded to a student who has demonstrated an interest in Indigenous Health, virtual care of AI, interprofessional practice, and decreasing barriers to health care access of vulnerable populations.

Doreen and Tony Gruza Scholarship

Awarded to a student who has completed one year of the Doctor of Medicine program and has participated significantly in their community as well as achieved high academic merit.

Arthur Lyle Bell Memorial Scholarship

The late Reverend Bell, during his illness, talked with junior medical students and stressed the importance of approaching the patient as a whole person. In his memory, a scholarship was established for a student who provides evidence of understanding the patient-physician relationship and demonstrates interest and potential talent in caring for the person, as well as treating the illness, from the moment of first contact.

Neurology Education Fund

The purpose of the Neurology Education Fund is to enhance the education experience of the undergraduate medical students in the College of Medicine, University of Saskatchewan.

John Hall Wedge Scholarship in Medicine

This award recognizes the academic achievement of a student entering their second year in the MD program at the College of Medicine.

Gregory Stilwell Memorial Scholarship

Dr. Gregory A. Stilwell was a faculty member in the Department of Microbiology for four and a half years. In his memory, a scholarship is awarded annually to the student who receives the highest mark in the medical microbiology courses.

The Flowers Bursary

This award was created through a bequest from the estate of Lilian Louise Flowers. She designated it be awarded annually to a student entering the second year of the MD program in the College of Medicine.

Kalapesi-Zavery Family Indigenous Medical Award

To recognize a University of Regina female, Indigenous alumni who is pursuing a medical degree at the College of Medicine, University of Saskatchewan.

Dr. Gertrude Crabtree Undergraduate Scholarship in Medicine

This scholarship is made possible by a gift from Ms. Shivon Crabtree in honour and memory of her sister-in-law, Dr. Gertrude Crabtree, who graduated from the University of Saskatchewan with an MD degree in 1977. This award is made on the basis of academic achievement, as well as consideration of a statement outlining strong ties to the province of Saskatchewan.

CJ Houston Prize in Medical History

This award was established by Dr. C.J. Houston, former head of the Department of Medical Imaging and is awarded annually to a first year medical student who submits the best essay on the History of Medicine.

Manju Khandelwal Memorial Scholarship

Manju L. Khandelwal was a university student who died in the crash of Air India flight 182 off the coast of Ireland on June 23, 1985. The Khandelwal family established a scholarship in her memory to the College of Medicine and recognizes a student's performance in Biochemistry courses prior to admission.

Dr. Janet Markland Memorial Scholarship

In memory of Dr. Janet Markland, this prize is intended to recognize and award students in the College of Medicine for their research projects and presentations, and to encourage careers in rheumatology.

Dr. Ernest McBrien Award

In memory of Dr. Ernest McBrien, this award is presented to a student who has participated in rural medicine experiences including their community experience and rural externship. The recipient must also demonstrate an interest in Family Medicine as a career choice.

College of Medicine First Year Student Award

This award was established by a group of graduate students and is awarded annually to students who are entering their first year of the MD program at the College of Medicine. The award is intended to welcome students to both the college and the broader community.

University of Saskatchewan Scholarships & USask Undergraduate Scholarships

The University of Saskatchewan Scholarships and the U of S Undergraduate Scholarships have been allocated to colleges based on the number of full-time undergraduate students enrolled in each college for the 2024-2025 fall and winter terms.

Dr. Neil Beck Memorial Scholarship

This award, made in memory of Dr. Neil R. Beck, is intended to recognize second-year MD students in the College of Medicine who have demonstrated academic excellence in endocrinology.

Sylvia Turner Scholarship in Medicine

Sylvia Louise Turner was born in Estevan in 1929. Sylvia believed in lifelong learning and passed this love onto her children, all of whom went to pursue higher education at Canadian universities.

Saskatchewan Medical Association (SMA) Prize

The SMA annually provides a prize to the student receiving the highest average in the clinical sciences component of the curriculum.

Anatomy Award

Presented annually to the undergraduate student that has attained the highest academic standing in courses taken in the Department of Anatomy.

Dean's Award in Medicine

The Dean's Award was established to recognize a student who has made an outstanding contribution in an area not evaluated by traditional methods. It could recognize a person who has achieved national distinction through activities outside the College of Medicine, such as theatre, writing, athletics, music, or the visual arts. The Dean of Medicine shall choose the recipient of the award.
