IMPORTANT TO-DO'S FOR YEAR 1 STUDENTS

Important Information for all YEAR 1 students (Regina and Saskatoon) can be found at <https://medicine.usask.ca/policies/information-for-first-year-medical-students.php#Welcome>

- Please review all the information at the link above.

SHA ID Card: As a Regina Campus student, your SHA ID card grants you access to various locations on campus, including 24-hour access to the Learning Centre, College of Medicine Wing, SHA Clinical Library, and RGH staff entrances.

Obtaining your SHA ID Card: Students must visit the RGH Parking Services office to obtain their SHA Photo ID.

- **Location:** Level 1 of RGH, beside elevators 5&6
- **When to go:** Students can pick up ID cards beginning July 22, 2026. Temporary reduced office hours are Monday to Friday, 10:00am - 3:00pm.
- **What to bring:** Valid photo ID (e.g. driver's license)
- **What to say:** Inform the staff member you are an incoming medical student needing an ID. Students who provided the College of Medicine with a preferred name that is different than their legal name should advise the staff member before their ID is printed.

Always carry your ID card; wearing your ID badge is mandatory while in SHA facilities.

**If you cannot get your ID before Orientation, you will still be able to access the Learning Centre during business hours.*

First Aid/CPR: All pre-clerkship students require certification in Standard First Aid with CPR BLS and AED. It is the student's responsibility to complete this training and keep certifications valid throughout pre-clerkship. Incoming Year 1 students are required to provide copies of their certification on the MEDC 111 Canvas Course. Immunizations: Students should begin this process upon admission to the College of Medicine. The University of Saskatchewan requires that all students attending a Health Science College provide documented proof of immunization. USask Student ID Card: Student ID Cards are ordered online. If you are new to the U of S, or you are an existing student with a card that is 4 years or older and wish to submit a new photo, please follow the instructions at <https://bookstore.usask.ca/campus-id.php>. ID Cards will be shipped to the Regina Campus to be distributed to you. Order your card by August 10, 2026, to ensure timely delivery.

Off-Campus Med Students USSU & GSA Student Health & Dental Plans:

The University of Saskatchewan student Health & Dental Plans have been put in place by the student associations to help students pay for the health services they need. The coverage includes health, dental, vision, and worldwide travel benefits, and is designed to pick up where provincial health care, NIHB, and/or other private health coverage ends.

As a student enrolled in an off-campus program at the University of Saskatchewan, you are not automatically enrolled in the USSU or GSA Health & Dental Plans, but you have the opportunity to enroll yourself, your spouse and/or dependents by contacting studentcare.net/works directly during the Fall Change-of-Coverage Period. Individual and family enrolments are completed by filling out the appropriate Enrolment Form, submitting it to studentcare.net/works, and paying an additional fee.

IMPORTANT: Enrolments can only be processed during the Change-of-Coverage Period, which is Sept. 1 – 30 for Term 1 students. Once successfully enrolled, coverage is valid from Sept. 1 – Aug. 31.

UNIFORM ROOMS & SCRUBS ACCESS

Scrubs for learning sessions in the surgery department or O.R. are available from the RGH and Pasqua uniform rooms. RGH Uniform Rooms are accessible 24/7 with your SHA ID card.

After use, uniforms are to be put into any BLUE soiled linen bag only and are not to be removed from the facility or laundered at home.

Students are able to borrow a maximum of two sets at a time. When the term is done, any scrubs you have not returned may be charged to you through the College of Medicine.

****Hospital-issued scrubs are not to be used for sessions that occur in the Learning Centre unless specifically directed****

MULTI-FAITH CENTRE:

Students on campus have access to a Multi-Faith Centre at Regina General Hospital (Level 2A). All are welcome to use this space for quiet reflection, meditation, or prayer.

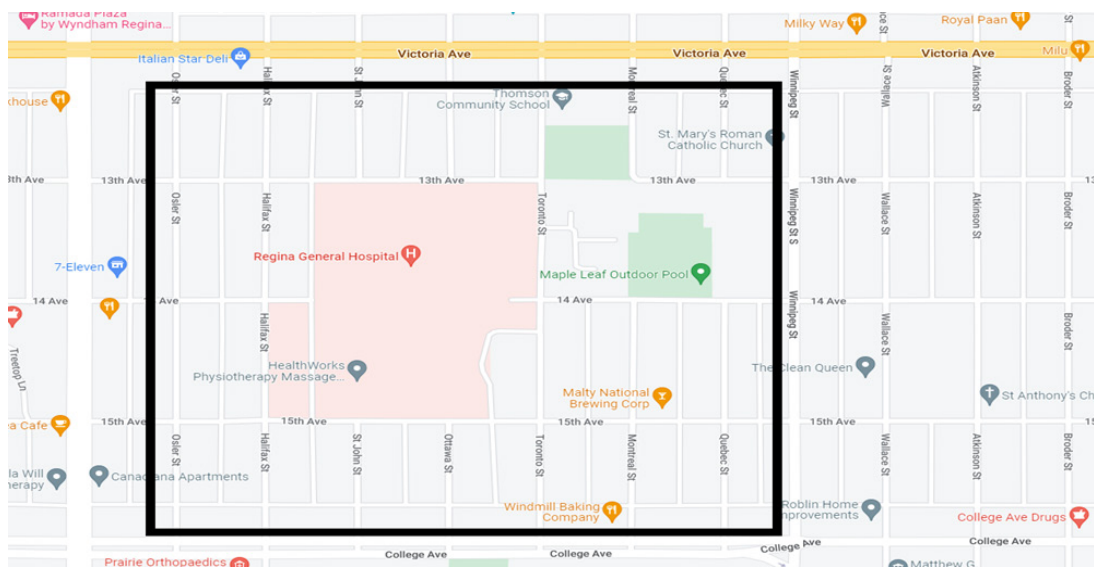


Parking & Transportation Options

Paid Parking: Medical students can purchase on-site parking at a cost of \$75.00/month. Students can purchase as many 1-month blocks at a time as they wish, up to 1 year. If you wish to purchase parking, please take the College of Medicine Parking Letter on Page 8 to the Finance window at the main 14th Avenue entrance at RGH to pay, and then take your receipt to the Parking Services Office.

Street Parking: As a general rule, parking around the RGH is 2 hour on streets within the black square indicated on the map. Outside the square may be 24 hours. ***Always check for signage to be sure, as the parking enforcement is strict around the hospital.*** Snow removal routes are posted and the city will declare when they are enforced. Shuttles Service Between Sites: If you have a learning session at Pasqua Hospital, Wascana Rehab Centre or Regina Centre Crossing, staff and learners have access to free shuttle buses that run between these sites. The schedule can be found on the RQH Intranet and is posted in the student lounge.

Bike compound: There are 3 bicycle compounds available. There are two lock and key compounds available, one near the staff entrance on 14th Ave, and one off the alley between 14th and 15th Ave on the West side of the building. Keys to these compounds are available at the Information/Switchboard for \$2.00 deposit.

There is an additional compound located at the east portion of the parkade, directly north of the elevator vestibule. It is a door activated card swipe access system. Security measures are in place by means of a security video camera directly within the compound. To obtain access to this compound, please make a request at the Parking & ID Services office.

You will be required to provide your photo ID to set up access/obtain keys to either compound.

RE: **City of Regina Transit Reimbursement Program**

The Regina Campus College of Medicine will reimburse students the difference in cost between City of Regina Transit Post-Secondary pass and a Saskatoon U-Pass to acknowledge a difference Regina Campus students face related to access to Regina transit costs.

Supporting the environment is one of the areas that the College of Medicine hopes to support by offering public transportation options to students to reduce air pollution and to encourage healthier habits for the future.

Current rates:

- Saskatoon U-Pass in Saskatoon is \$20.19 per month
- City of Regina Transit Post-Secondary 31 Day Pass is \$86.00 per month

The College of Medicine will reimburse students up to \$66.00 per month based on current rates.

Here is the process:

1. Purchase your City of Regina transit pass. You may need to provide University of Saskatchewan Student Card, Saskatchewan Health Authority identification, or government issued identification, such as a drivers' license.
2. Reimbursement: email your original receipt of payment to Ledua Senego, Finance & Admin Coordinator, Regina Campus invoices.regina@usask.ca.

To assist in the efficiency of the reimbursement process, email your receipts no later than the following dates:

- December 13, 2026 for receipts from (Jul-Dec 2026) of 2026-27 academic year
- April 13, 2027 for receipts for remainder of 2026-27 academic year

Please feel free to submit your proof of payment receipts earlier than the above dates.

Supporting student wellness, Regina Campus College of Medicine recognizes that students may not have quick access to a fitness or aquatic facility as the Saskatoon Based Undergraduate students do. The Fitness and Lifestyle Facilities and Aquatic Facilities Reimbursement program is for students using fitness and/or aquatics facilities.

There are excellent facilities at the University of Regina Campus, City of Regina locations, and private locations. There are on site Saskatchewan Health Authority Fit Clubs at the Regina General Hospital and the Wascana Rehabilitation Centre.

The College of Medicine will reimburse students \$20.00 per month for any Fitness and Lifestyle Centre and \$10.00 per month for any Aquatics Centre.

Here is the process:

1. Purchase your pass. When purchasing at the University of Regina, you may need to show government issued identification, such as a drivers' license.
2. Reimbursement: email your original receipt of payment(s)/ proof of payment / fitness centre statements to Ledua Senego, Finance & Admin Coordinator, Regina Campus: invoices.regina@usask.ca .

To assist in the efficiency of the reimbursement process, email your receipts no later than the following dates:

- December 13, 2026: receipts from (Jul - Dec, 2026) of 2026-27 academic year
- April 13, 2027: receipts for remainder of 2026-27 academic year

Please feel free to submit your proof of payment receipts earlier than the above dates.

Access to USask Library e-books, journals, databases

Use your NSID and password to get access to all our ebooks, ejournals, and databases including Ovid MEDLINE, Embase, and more. Set up the Proxy Bookmarklet so that you can connect to our subscribed content directly from a journal's home page and Google Scholar so that you can see links to USask subscriptions.

Apps

Download Access, Clinical Key Student, DynaMed, Lexidrug, and RxFiles for free as part of the Library's subscription fees. Go to <https://libguides.usask.ca/mobileapps/> to find out more.

Access to USask Library Print collection

The USask Library mails print books to students living anywhere in Canada (except the Saskatoon USask Campus). Go to <https://library.usask.ca/ddls> to register.

Interlibrary Loan

If you need access to an article from a journal to which the USask Library does not subscribe, fill in an interlibrary loan request (use the "Request this item from another library through our Interlibrary Loan (ILL) service" link that comes up when you click "Get It at USask" or "Get Full Text at USask"); this is a free service, and usually takes only a few business days. You will receive an email containing a link which allows you to download the article.
