

This catalogue aims to highlight the many communities that host clerkship students during their rural rotation. We thought it would be helpful to provide you with some information about our rural sites prior to you making your selection.

While on your rotation, we encourage all of you to strongly consider family medicine as your future career. Saskatchewan FM Postgraduate training focuses on creating expert generalists. Saskatchewan sites will expose you to the depth and breadth of family medicine. Training prepares you for full-scope family medicine practice anywhere in Canada, including intrapartum obstetrics, urgent care, minor office-based procedures (“lumps and bumps”, IUD insertion, vasectomy, joint injections, etc.), palliative care, long-term care, and hospital care.

Clerkship is an exciting time in your medical school journey. As a department, we strive to seek and incorporate feedback from our students to continuously improve our rotation. We hope you will thoroughly enjoy your experience in family medicine. Family medicine is the backbone of the primary care system, and we know patients have better outcomes when they have a family doctor!



COMMUNITY OVERVIEW

Stony Rapids is situated on the Fond du Lac River, east of Lake Athabasca. It is a beautiful natural setting worthy of a resort. The village's facilities include 3 general stores with an assortment of high-priced foods and goods. Learners have access to 2 meals per day (lunch and supper) at the hospital kitchen, free of charge. There are a few restaurants: White Water Inn, Al's Place.

CULTURAL DEMOGRAPHICS

Predominantly Dene Indigenous peoples with English as their second language. Physicians serve a population of about 3500 people scattered amongst five communities (Stony Rapids, Black Lake, Fond du Lac, Uranium City, and Camsell Portage).

TRANSPORTATION OPTIONS

Air travel transportation to/from the site is required. While on site, the usage of the CVA vehicles by learners is given authorization by Northern Medical Services to operate the vehicle with a valid driver's license. However, the vehicle is not meant to be provided to learners for their sole use, and can only be used when not in use by a physician.

WHAT ARE YOUR CLINIC HOURS, CALL STRUCTURE/SCHEDULE AND EMR SYSTEM?

- SR hospital rounds are generally held at 0930 during the week with some flexibility on weekends
- Four outpatient clinics weekly at AHF. SR Clinics held: Mon-Thurs – 2-5pm. The physician on-call does the outpatient clinic of the day, handles emergencies and deals with telephone calls from the nursing stations
- Call schedule will be discussed with learner upon arrival and follows U/M Medical Clerkship Work Hours and Call Policy
- EMR system used is MedAccess

OTHER THINGS TO BE AWARE OF:

The Athabasca Health Facility provides comprehensive health services in an integrated and holistic manner to support, nurture and restore physical, mental, spiritual and emotional health. All residents and communities enjoy equal access to quality services that are comparable to provincial and federal standards, while being culturally appropriate. ÎLE-À-LA-CROSSE



COMMUNITY OVERVIEW

The town of Île-à-la-Crosse has 3 grocery stores, 2 convenience stores/gas bars, a take-out restaurant, a youth centre and a restaurant/motel/tavern. Recreationally, the strength is in the great outdoors. There is a cross-country ski trail, curling rink, skating rink, running track, a work-out room, and, of course, a large neighbouring lake and river system for fishing, canoeing, kayaking, camping, and, in winter, skating or snowmobiles. The high school has a library and a gymnasium available for after-hours recreation. Being a remote community, grocery prices tend to be slightly higher than in the city, but we do have a full service Coop grocery store as of 2022. There are some limited gluten-free grocery items available and infrequent/no vegan substitutes for dairy/meat products.

CULTURAL DEMOGRAPHICS

Île-à-la-Crosse is the second oldest community in Saskatchewan following establishment of the Red River Colony in 1811. It is of exceptional historical note, given its prime access to trading posts located further within the North-Western Territory, which in turn promoted significant interest from both Catholic missionaries and fur trading companies. The populations of Île-à-la-Crosse is about 1400 and the catchment area is about 8000. The population is predominantly Indigenous with a mix of Dene, Cree, and Metis peoples.

TRANSPORTATION OPTIONS

There are no transportation options to and from the community so a vehicle would be required.

WHAT CARE CENTRES DO CLERKS DO THEIR ROTATIONS?

- Primary Care Clinic
- 24hr ER
- Acute Care Hospital
- Long-term care
- There are also outpost clinics that clerks will travel to.

WHAT ARE YOUR CLINIC HOURS, CALL STRUCTURE/SCHEDULE AND EMR SYSTEM?

- Day starts at 0845h with hospital rounds or LTC rounds/meetings/teaching and the clinic day typically ends at 1700h.
- On-call duties start at 0845h and you are on call for 24 hrs. This is designated as "home heavy call" but typically learners stay in the hospital for the duration of the 24 hr call. Clerks will usually do 1 weekend (one Saturday or one Friday/Sunday) during their rotation with an overall call frequency of 1:4 or 1:5
- The EMR system is MedAccess

OTHER THINGS TO BE AWARE OF:

- We are a dedicated group of physicians who are passionate about remote generalism and community engagement
- We love teaching and having learners at all stages in their development. It gives us the opportunity to stay up-to-date clinically and get people excited about a career in rural/remote family medicine!

COMMUNITY OVERVIEW

La Ronge is home to major businesses, health, government and education centres and several smaller communities. At La Ronge you will find all of the items required for daily life, including groceries to giftware and restaurants.

CULTURAL DEMOGRAPHICS

While our physician base is at the Medical Clinic in La Ronge, Northern Medical Services provides services for a population of approximately 14000, including the outlying communities of Pinehouse, Stanley Mission, Southend and Wollaston. The population of La Ronge is 2500, Air Ronge's population is 1000, with 3500 from the Lac La Ronge Indian Band.

TRANSPORTATION OPTIONS

There are no transportation options to and from the community so a vehicle would be required.

WHAT CARE CENTRES DO CLERKS DO THEIR ROTATIONS?

- La Ronge Health Centre

TRAVEL CLINICS

Yes. Each weekday one or two physicians fly out (in an R-8 seater plane or by helicopter) to the outlying communities of either Stanley Mission, Pinehouse, Southend and Wollaston, to provide medical clinics. Clerks are also scheduled to attend resident-run community clinics with the residents and nurses from the Jeannie Bird Clinic at Hall Lake, Grandmother's Bay, Sucker River, the LLRIB Group Home, Catherine Charles Long Term Care, Scattered Site and 3 High Schools.

WHAT ARE YOUR CLINIC HOURS, CALL STRUCTURE/SCHEDULE AND EMR SYSTEM?

- Weekday rounds at the hospital are from 0830-1030
Clinic begins at 1030
- The EMR system is MedAccess

OTHER THINGS TO BE AWARE OF:

- Year-round, the community presents opportunity for social contact with community events (The Saskaloppet Cross Country Ski Competition, The Canadian Challenge International Dog Sled Race, and The La Ronge Ice Wolves Junior "A" SJHL Hockey Team to name a few), spectator sports, music, and discussions
- Ski-doo and Fishing Derbies (ice and summer) are also excellent events, along with the Annual Winter Festival and other Cultural events
- You are urged to take full advantage of these opportunities as a means to better understand both the local residents and yourself in the light of cultural background

COMMUNITY OVERVIEW

Melfort, the “City of Northern Lights”, is nestled in the heart of Saskatchewan’s great North East, a land dominated by soil rich farmland and a variety of forests, lakes and beaches. At a population of approximately 6000, Melfort offers a refuge from excessive crime, traffic tie-ups, and stress. Melfort also offers very good health and education services. The Melfort Union Hospital provides a wide spectrum of clinical services and the North East School Division provides exceptional opportunities for academic growth of the communities young citizens.

COMMUNITY OVERVIEW

Swift Current has a very reasonable cost of living. Learners only have to pay for food and their transportation when they visit us. Main industries are agriculture and oil and gas.

CULTURAL DEMOGRAPHICS

As of 2021, the population of Swift Current was 16,750. There are about 2,240 visible minorities here but we have a very low Indigenous group. Filipino is our highest visible minority at this time. Average age is 40's and the household income average is 78,000. From 2011-2016 was the highest number of immigration.
