



Acceptable Certifying Officials



In any country	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Notary public• Lawyers (member of an official bar association)• First-class magistrates, judges/justices of the peace
In the United States only	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• An official listed as acceptable in any country (above), as well as:• Commissioner of oaths (provided that they have an official government agency appointment and an ENGLISH OR FRENCH seal or stamp)
In Canada only	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• An official listed as acceptable in any country (above), as well as:• Commissioner of oaths (provided that they have an official government agency appointment and an ENGLISH OR FRENCH seal or stamp)• Mayor• Police officer (municipal, provincial or RCMP; contact information must include badge number and headquarter location)• Dean or Assistant Dean at the candidate's faculty (school) of medicine

Please note:

- The certifying official must see and photocopy the original documents and certify the photocopies;
- The certifying official must include his/her name and contact information;
- The certifying official must apply his/her stamp;
- The certifying official must declare and wrote “I certify this to be a true copy of the original”;
- The certifying official must sign and date the certification;
- The certifying official must provide expiry date (if required);
- Improper certification will result in delays;
- Candidates must NOT certify their own documents;
- Candidates are responsible for the costs of certification.
