 - 2. Differential treatment compared to other students in the class or program, where the alleged differential treatment affected assessment of the student's academic work or performance;
 - 3. Alleged discrimination or harassment, as set out in the university's Policy on Discrimination and Harassment Prevention and associated procedures where the where the alleged discrimination or harassment affected assessment of the student's academic work or performance;
 - 4. Failure to implement the approved policy and procedures of the university concerning accommodation of students with disabilities, when the alleged failure affected assessment of the student's academic work or performance;
 - 5. New evidence has arisen that could not reasonably have been presented at the initial hearing and that would likely have affected the decision of the original decision-making body.
