

Program Objectives

T-TIME is part of Faculty Development's Core Programming. By participating in Faculty Development programming, you will be able to:

- Enhance Curriculum Delivery Deliver curriculum objectives using appropriate delivery methods, tools and approaches using evidence-based strategies from the current medical education literature.
- Strengthen Assessment Practices Apply evidence-based strategies for assessment (whether traditional formative or summative approaches or new approaches including work-based assessment and e-Portfolios), applicable to all levels of learners and programming from UGME to CME.
- Deepen Educational Foundations Describe underlying principles of medical education relevant to the needs of USask programming along the continuum of lifelong learning from UGME to CME.



Study Credit Certification:

Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada: This event is an Accredited Group Learning Activity (Section 1) as defined by the Maintenance of Certification program of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, and approved by the Continuing Medical Education Division, University of Saskatchewan. You may claim a maximum of 1.5 hours (credits are automatically calculated).

The College of Family Physicians of Canada: Accredited Royal College MOC Section 1 and Section 3 credits are eligible for certified Mainpro+® credits, up to a maximum of 50 credits per five-year cycle; any additional credits are eligible as non-certified Mainpro+® credits.
