Funding is for a 2-year period. Mid-year progress reports will be submitted to the IAMSE Educational Scholarship Committee. The Principal Investigator of each funded project will be awarded an additional \$1,500 travel award to present the results of their grant research at a future IAMSE meeting. Any scholarship (e.g., publications, posters) resulting from IAMSE-funded research must acknowledge the IAMSE Educational Scholarship grant on the work.
