



Bio of Dr. Morris Markentin:

Dr. Morris Markentin completed his MD in 1996 at the University of Saskatchewan. As the Cofounder and Board of Directors Chair for Sanctum Care Group, he is instrumental in upholding the mission of providing care to people living with HIV/AIDS that is dignified, non-judgmental and unconditional. Dr. Markentin specializes in family medicine and addictions medicine, and actively practices at Saskatoon's Westside Community Clinic providing primary care with a focus on chronic viral illnesses - HIV and Hepatitis C, as well as addiction medicine and opiate agonist therapy. Dr. Markentin is a five-time Sanctum Survivor participant, which sees community leaders live as if homeless for 36-hours to shed light on the intense hardship faced by people who experience poverty, homelessness, and chronic illness in Saskatoon. Dr. Markentin is also an avid kayaker and outdoors enthusiast.

Positive Psychiatry and Successful Aging



Bio of Dr. Alanna Baillod:

Dr. Baillod is a Geriatric Psychiatrist and an Assistant Professor in the Department of Psychiatry at the University of Saskatchewan. She completed her MD and Psychiatry residency at USASK and completed her Geriatric Psychiatry subspecialty training at the University of Ottawa.

Dr. Baillod has been in clinical practice since 2014. Her current practice includes long-term care consultation, community outreach to seniors' homes, outpatient psychiatry, and neurostimulation. Dr. Baillod is also interested in medical education and is currently the Psychiatry Clerkship Director, the residency program Competence Committee Chair, and the Assistant Program Director for the Psychiatry residency program. Dr. Baillod has been a member of the RCPSC Geriatric Psychiatry Examination board for several years and became the Co-Chair of the Examination board in January 2023.

Mental Health and COVID-19 in Saskatchewan:

are the kids ok?



Bio of Dr. Tamara Hinz:

Tamara Hinz is a child and adolescent psychiatrist and assistant professor in the College of Medicine at the University of Saskatchewan from the graduating class of 2008. In addition to clinical and academic roles, she is a passionate advocate for youth with mental health struggles and other marginalized populations. She frequently serves as a voice in conventional and social media to provide public education and advocacy on a variety of health topics. In 2021, she was the recipient of the Provincial Department Head's Award in recognition of exemplary advocacy and leadership in academic/clinical psychiatry. Dr. Hinz is the current (and first female) president of the Saskatchewan Psychiatric Association.

DR. SCOTT MCLEOD

Regroup; Recharge; Refocus



Bio of Dr. Scott McLeod:

Scott McLeod is the Registrar of the College of Physicians & Surgeons of Alberta (CPSA) – the licensing and regulatory body for Alberta doctors and the past president of the Federation of Medical Regulatory Authorities of Canada (FMRAC).

He received his MD from the University of Saskatchewan in 1993, and went on to complete his family medicine residency in Regina. He was granted his CCFP in 1995. He also completed a specialty in Aerospace medicine with the US Air Force in 2005. He has a Master of Public Health from the University of Texas and a Master of Public Administration from the Royal Military College of Canada.

Prior to joining the CPSA, Scott spent just under 27 years with the Canadian Armed Forces, where he led health care teams, planned, developed, and executed strategic, operational and tactical level plans in a wide variety of health fields. During his years of service, he had three operational deployments and lived and worked in multiple provinces and countries. He retired as the Deputy Surgeon General in 2017.

Bio of Dr. James Dosman:

Dr. Dosman earned his MD from the University of Saskatchewan in 1963 and was a family doctor in Saskatoon before specializing in Respiratory Medicine. In 1975 Dr. Dosman became founding Head of the Division of Respiratory Medicine, in 1986 founding Director of the Centre for Agricultural Medicine, in 2006 founding Director of the Canadian Centre for Health and Safety in Agriculture, and in 2011 established the National Agricultural Industrial Hygiene Laboratory, all at the University of Saskatchewan. He was the founding Co-chair of the Canadian Rural Health Research Society. He established the Agricultural Health and Safety Network in Saskatchewan, a farm safety program involving 30,000 families. He worked with the International Labour Organization of the United Nations in establishing an International Code of Safe Practice in Agriculture. From 2005 to 2009 he served on the Canadian Nuclear Safety Commission. In 2007 he was instrumental in founding and is currently President and CEO of Agrivita Canada Inc. In 2013 he completed the American Board of Internal Medicine exams to become Certified in Sleep Medicine. He continues an active medical practice in sleep medicine and research in health and safety of rural and indigenous populations, CIHR (2021).

Dr. Mark Fenton is the Division Head of Respirology, Critical Care and Sleep Medicine at the University of Saskatchewan College of Medicine. He is also the Director of the Saskatchewan Lung Transplant Clinic. Dr. Fenton is a three-time alumnus of the University of Saskatchewan, earning a Bachelor of Science degree in Anatomy and Cell Biology, Masters' degree in Pathology and a Doctor of Medicine degree. He completed Royal College fellowships in Internal Medicine and Respirology followed by additional fellowship training in Sleep Medicine and Lung Transplantation.

Bio of Dr. Anita Chakravarti:

Dr. Anita Chakravarti is a professor and Wellness Lead at USASK Continuing Medical Education and a member of the Department of Anesthesiology, Perioperative Medicine and Pain Medicine, and Associate Faculty at the Centre of Integrative Medicine.

In addition to providing services in Clinical Anesthesiology, Intensive Care and the St. Paul's Hospital Pain Clinic, she was the first Medical Director of the Saskatoon Chronic Pain Center. Dr. Chakravarti was on the National Task Force to have Pain Medicine recognized as a subspecialty of the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada, Co-Chair of the Pain Education Committee of the Canadian Pain Society and Medical Advisor to the Canadian Pain Coalition. Dr. Chakravarti is a board member of the Saskatchewan Pain Society.

Dr. Chakravarti is a certified Facilitator and Faculty of Mindful Practice * which incorporates mindfulness, narrative medicine and appreciative inquiry, and wellness and mindfulness sessions and keynotes. Dr. Chakravarti is C.E.O. of [M] Power Mindful Professional Practice.
